


- 1 Traditional Charity Care**  
\$9,222,320  
Free or discounted health services provided to persons who cannot afford to pay. In Northern Kentucky, roughly 7.8% of residents do not have insurance.
- 2 Unpaid Costs for Medicaid and Indigent Care**  
\$44,575,641  
Costs absorbed by St. Elizabeth Healthcare when government reimbursements don't fully cover the cost of treatment and subsidized health services that are provided despite a financial loss.
- 3 Community Health Improvement**  
\$1,825,196  
Covers an array of community programs that focus on health education, treatment and prevention, such as health fairs, screening programs and immunization clinics.
- 4 Health Profession Education**  
\$2,702,431  
Training and teaching of tomorrow's healthcare professionals. This includes our Family Practice Residency, Nursing Partnerships, Radiology, Lab and other professional programs.
- 5 Subsidized Health Services**  
\$2,764,436  
Costs absorbed by St. Elizabeth Healthcare when government reimbursements don't fully cover the cost of treatment and subsidized health services that are provided despite a financial loss.
- 6 Research**  
\$944,391  
Refers to any study or investigation undertaken with a goal of producing knowledge that is made available to the public. It includes clinical and community health research, as well as studies on healthcare delivery.
- 7 Cash and In-Kind Contributions**  
\$7,022,385  
Refers to contributions made by the organization to healthcare and other community organizations that support community and/or social service organizations and promote health in the community.
- 8 Community Building Activities**  
\$837,211  
Funds and in-kind services donated to individuals or the community at large including donation of time, food, equipment and supplies.
- 9 Medicare Losses**  
\$12,086,810  
Costs absorbed by St. Elizabeth Healthcare when government reimbursements don't fully cover the cost of treatment and subsidized health services that are provided despite a financial loss.
- 10 Uncompensated Care**  
\$10,423,662  
The cost hospitals incur as a result of services provided to patients from whom payment was expected, but not received.

Community Benefit and Uncompensated Care amounts are based on the actual costs of providing the care vs. charges.

 \$339,634

- 4 Cash and In-Kind Contributions**  
 \$1,690

 \$2,654
