Upcoming Change to the 2-2222 Emergency Line

To better connect callers to the right team faster, starting <u>Monday</u>, <u>March 31st</u>, callers will hear: "This is the St. Elizabeth emergency line. For medical emergencies, press 1. For all other emergencies,

press 2."

- "1" should be selected for medical emergencies, such as Code Blue or BART
- "2" should be selected for all other emergencies

If no option is selected, calls will be routed to the team who manages medical emergencies. For non-emergencies and general Security needs, the 1-2270 number can still be used.
